Ottawa Drug Treatment Court Program

The **Ottawa Drug Treatment Court (DTCO)** is specifically designed to assist non-violent offenders (18+) experiencing problems with substance use. **Honesty** and **accountability** are cornerstones of the program.

Eligibility Criteria

- Experiencing <u>substance use problems</u>
- Have an outstanding, <u>non-violent</u> criminal code charge that is <u>related to their</u> substance use problems
- Trafficking charges must be <u>"street level"</u> (on scale to maintain their drug habit).
- Approval by the Crown Attorney,
 Rideauwood Addiction and Family
 Services (Rideauwood) and DTC Judge

Eligible Applicants must

- Voluntarily consent to participation
- Accept responsibility for offence and enter guilty plea (sentencing is delayed)
- Complete a DTC application with assistance from their lawyer or duty counsel (application packages available through Crown Attorney's Office)
- Undergo an <u>assessment by Rideauwood</u>.
 <u>staff</u> to determine program suitability

Program Expectations

- Attendance at treatment centre up to <u>5</u>
 days/week for individual/group
 counselling delivered by Rideauwood
- Case management support in meeting basic needs and assistance with jobsearches, employment readiness and/or academic upgrading
- Randomized weekly urine testing
- Weekly court attendance by participants and Rideauwood staff
- Participants may be discharged for repeated or very serious issues and proceed to sentencing in a regular court
- Minimum 9 months commitment
- Completion of the program will result in a <u>non-custodial sentence (other than jail)</u> <u>at Crown's discretion</u>

Participants must <u>prepare a</u> reintegration plan prior to graduation

FAQs

Q: Are participants automatically withdrawn for drug/alcohol use?

Q: Are participants automatically withdrawn if they fail to meet program expectations?

A: No. DTCO recognizes that participants may struggle with abstinence early in the program. However, DTCO is **abstinence-based** so honesty around use is expected.

A: No. The goal is a change of lifestyle that takes time. However, there <u>may be sanctions imposed</u> to be determined by the Court Team and DTCO Judge.

Ottawa Early Intervention Drug Treatment Court Program

The Ottawa Early Intervention Drug Treatment Court (EIDTC) is specifically designed to assist non-violent offenders (18+) experiencing problems with substance use at an earlier stage of criminal involvement.

Honesty and accountability are cornerstones of the program.

Eligibility Criteria

- Experiencing <u>substance use problems</u>
- Have an outstanding, <u>non-violent</u> criminal code charge that is <u>related to their</u> <u>substance use problems</u>
- Must be in an <u>early stage of criminal</u> <u>involvement</u>
- Approval by the Crown Attorney,
 Rideauwood Addiction and Family Services
 (Rideauwood) and EIDTC Judge

Eligible Applicants must

- Voluntarily consent to participation
- Accept responsibility for offence and enter guilty plea (sentencing is delayed)
- Complete an EIDTC application with assistance from their lawyer or duty counsel (application packages available through Crown Attorney's Office)
- Undergo an <u>assessment by Rideauwood</u>
 <u>staff</u> to determine program suitability

Program Expectations

- Attendance at treatment centre up to <u>3</u>
 <u>days/week for individual/group</u>
 <u>counselling</u> delivered by Rideauwood
- Case management support in meeting basic needs and assistance with jobsearches, employment readiness and/or academic upgrading
- Randomized weekly urine testing
- Weekly court attendance
- Participants <u>may be discharged</u> for repeated or very serious issues and <u>proceed to regular sentencing</u>
- Minimum 16 weeks commitment
- Completion of the program will result in charges being <u>withdrawn</u>, <u>stayed or a</u> <u>non-custodial sentence (other than jail)</u> <u>at Crown's discretion</u>
- Participants must <u>prepare a</u> <u>reintegration plan</u> prior to graduation
