Elevating Care Through Learning

At Rideauwood, our commitment to excellence in addiction and mental health services is rooted in continuous learning and development. Our comprehensive onboarding immerses new counselors in specialized knowledge - from trauma-informed care and gambling/gaming fundamentals to addiction intervention. This process instills our core Philosophy of Care from day one. We've cultivated a rich tapestry of training programs for all staff, equipping the team with tools for inclusive, effective support. From Indigenous Cultural Safety to Anti-Racist and Anti-Oppressive care, these efforts enhance client care and contribute to a more compassionate community.

Integrated with our performance review and annual budgeting, we regularly refine our professional development. Staff enhance skills in areas like family violence education, solution-focused therapy, group facilitation, and French Language Health Services. We've also developed sustainable in-house training, such as our suicide prevention competency, ensuring critical skills remain sharp regardless of turnover.

This ongoing investment in our staff yields immeasurable returns - evident in the confidence of our team, the satisfaction of our clients, and the strength of our community partnerships. As we move forward, we remain dedicated to this journey of growth, promising ever-improving care for those we serve. Ultimately, our commitment to learning and development isn't just about building skills - it's about transforming lives. With each new competency, we're elevating the standard of addiction and mental health services, one empowered staff member at a time.




Building Hope: Matthew Perry House Launch

This year, Rideauwood proudly partnered in an inspiring effort to bring Matthew Perry House to life — a transformative initiative dedicated to providing housing, on-site care, and comprehensive supports for approximately 160 individuals on their healing journey.

In collaboration with Ottawa Community Housing, Ottawa Salus, CAPSA, The Royal Ottawa Mental Health Centre, the Ottawa Black Mental Health Coalition, and the Ottawa Aboriginal Coalition, this project exemplifies what can be achieved when a community unites to address complex needs with compassion and courage.

As a leader in evidence-based programming Rideauwood will be responsible for designing and delivering tailored recovery programs that will meet the diverse needs of Matthew Perry House residents. The approach integrates counselling, life skills development, and relapse prevention strategies—ensuring individuals have the tools and support they need to maintain long-term stability.

This partnership embodies Rideauwood's core vision: fostering a healthy, connected community where individuals are empowered to navigate their unique recovery journeys while strengthening the supportive systems around them. We are proud to help shape a space that offers safety, healing, and boundless possibility.






Programs

Adult Programs

The Adult Substance Use Program supports participants in making changes to their substance use and quality of life through goal setting, skill building and group work. Participants of this group work towards their unique goals over the course of this program, which may involve reducing or moderating their use of one or more substances or may also involve working towards the goal of complete abstinence. The Problem Gambling program offers prevention, education, and treatment to address problem gambling. This program helps people understand the nature of gambling to see how it has affected their lives and the lives of others, to set goals, and learn the skills to support the change they are seeking. The Urgent Substance Use Treatment program provides rapid access to individual counselling support to individuals facing acute circumstances due to opioid-related and/or substance use concerns and experience increase risk to self and/or others.



Youth & Young Adult Programs

Rideauwood offers comprehensive support for youth and young adults dealing with substance use, behavioural addictions, and related mental health challenges. The Youth and Young Adult Substance Use Program provides psychoeducation, counselling, and referrals through individual and group services. The Youth Justice Program supports those involved with the judicial system, offering similar services tailored to this population. As part of the Kids Come First Health Team, Rideauwood collaborates on initiatives like 1Call1Click and works with CHEO to deliver substance use education, assessments, and referrals. Additionally, at St. Mary's Home, Rideauwood provides counselling for young clients facing addiction and mental health issues.

School-Based Programs

Our School-Based Program offers prevention, education, and treatment for students facing substance use, behavioural addictions, and mental health issues. Serving OCDSB high schools, we provide individual counseling, family support, and psychoeducation for staff and parents. Our Rideauwood Prevention and Education Program (RPEP) teaches grade 7/8 students emotional regulation and decision-making skills.

Drug Treatment Court

Rideauwood provides this specialized therapeutic court program for individuals involved in the justice system due to substance use. The Ottawa Drug Treatment Court (DTC) offers tailored treatment for clients referred from the justice system, helping them meet both therapeutic and legal obligations.



Families & Parents Programs

The Family Spiral is a two-evening program for family members, friends and support persons concerned about someone with a substance use disorder, behavioural use disorder or related mental health issue. The SMART for Family and Friends program is a weekly drop-in group based on self-management and recovery training. The Family R.E.S.E.T. (Resource, Education, Support, and Empowerment Training) program is intended to help clients that are indirectly affected by someone else's substance use or behavioural addiction. It provides information on addiction, communication skills, emotions, education, and setting healthy boundaries. Individual counselling is offered to family members and parents along side the group to further support individual and family healing. The Urgent Substance Use Treatment Program for Families and Parents provides immediate prevention, education and individual counselling services for family members, parents and support persons of people experiencing opioid-related and other urgent substance use issues.

Program Goals



Education programs are tailored to different client groups, and they explore the "hows" and "whys" of problematic substance use, behavioural addictions and related mental health issues. These programs also offer options for healthy ways to cope.




The Last Chapter of a Proud Tradition


#CraftChange with Maker House Ottawa
